The Cooperative Fund was created in 2017 by CARE, on the basis of the agricultural cooperatives, supported under the ENPARD cooperatives project. It assists agricultural cooperatives in Georgia to develop their businesses, through increasing their access to financial and technical resources. It provides financial resources to the cooperatives and teaches how to effectively use them, through technical assistance and capacity building.

The Cooperative fund is a not-for-profit member- based entity with unique governance structure, democratic control and decision-making that allows cooperatives to be involved in management, have reasonable control over the resources and make their decisions for their development.

Different from the typical financial institutions, the fund is focused on financial well-being of its member cooperatives. The uniqueness of the model is that, the each dollar contributed to the fund's budget is not used only once, but constantly revolves, reaches its members and is used multiple times for the development of the cooperatives.





KORENISHI

"Korenishi" is a newly founded cooperative working on beekeeping and honey production. With the new beehives and bee families that the cooperative received through the grant, as well as the truck for seasonal transportation, its members expect the rise in their production and income for the future.



The cooperative "Mtis Nobati" is a second-level cooperative which consists of three different cooperatives working on beekeeping and producing honey: "Khvamli", "Alpuri Nektari" and "Svanuri Putkari", located in the villages of both Tsageri and Lentekhi municipalities.

Members of cooperative "Madliani Takveri" had a long experience of working together in beekeeping sector. Currently owning 268 bee families, the cooperative produces natural honey of three sorts-chestnut, linden and acacia, and plan to add alpine honey as well. The beehives are located in mountainous areas of Tsageri region and the cooperative ensures to keep their product natural. With the financial support, the cooperative received additional 100 beehives, electro knives, braces and all materials necessary for beekeeping and further widening their production.



Members of the cooperative "Otsneba" have practiced beekeeping during 20 years and already accumulated their own clients, but participation in the program opened new opportunities for them. Since they received all the necessary inventories required for beekeeping, the cooperative now hopes to expand their bee families up to 500, and breeding mother bees. Meanwhile, producing natural and free-of pesticides honey is the main priority for the cooperative.

"We got more opportunities since we became a cooperative. It's very different from working alone. The cost is less and you get more result. Although in the beginning cooperatives were overlooked by many people, they realized that when farmers cooperate and unite in the cooperative, they have a good chance to become good competitors with other large organizations on market".



Kulbaki fishing pond is located in a remote village in Tsageri. The natural cold water with the consistent temperature creates perfect condition for growing ecological fish. The members of "Kulbaki" had owned fish pond for a long time, but due to lack of technical and financial resources, their business wasn't advancing and the production wasn't high. With the grant, the cooperative now owns an excavator which allowed them to clean the road, expand the fish ponds. The cooperative also received a car for transporting fish to markets. As a result, the production has increased. "Before, the work in ponds was done manually and lot of risks were involved. The production was little and the demand too. Since we formed a cooperative and received the equipment, the production and market has increased, kept improving. Through the hard work and financial assistance, we saw the results and plan to expand our activities."

"We got knowledge from trainings that opened us to more opportunities. We moved forward not only economically, but personally too."





"Doghurashi", a winemaking cooperative, produces red semi-sweet wine from "Orbeluri Ojaleshi", an endemic sort of grape growing particularly in the area. The cooperative built a factory which was equipped with wine processing equipment through the grant program. After the cooperative was created, the amount of wine sold by the cooperative has increased. The members now are waiting for higher prices and more income from sales.



The members of cooperative "Nergebi" have a long experience of cooperation. The cooperative owns Usakhelauri and Tsolikouri vineyards, among which Usakhelauri is an endemic sort of grapes growing only in a small area of the village Okureshi. The cooperative owns the 50 percent of Usakhelauri vineyards growing in the area. The members of the cooperative have dedicated their work and time to highlight the uniqueness of the wine and develop the concept for their wine production.

With the grant, the cooperative received wine processing equipment that allowed them to equip a new factory and fully Location: Lechkhumi, Tsageri, village Okureshi process the Usakhelauri grapes. The cooperative also works on grape seedlings, and managed to save and revive the unique sort. As most cooperatives supported by the project, Nergebi employs local population in their work on a constant basis.



BUKISTSIKHE 1811

Bukistsikhe, the village where the cooperative "Bukistsikhe 1811" is founded, is famous for its oldest wine making traditions and unique grapes, such as Chkhaveri, one of the rarest grapes to produce naturally Rosen wine. Besides Chkhaveri, the members of the cooperative own two other sorts of grapes, and started a cooperative with a well thought concept to revive and promote wine-making traditions of their village. With the grant, the cooperative received wine processing equipment, and built a factory with their own contribution.

"Financing wasn't the main thing we had in mind when we created the cooperative. We also thought how to benefit our community and village. Now we're gradually improving, the factory satisfies the standards and is allowing us full processing. We expect to have more production than we had initially estimated".








TABGAAL

Cooperative "Tabgaal" collects different sorts of wild fruit from faraway areas in the mountains: dog-rose, blueberry, black plums, herbal plants ... and produces healthy and natural production-dry fruits and different sweets. The cooperative is also engaged in seedlings production. Before engaging in the program, the access to mountainous places was limited for the cooperative and the lack of technical facilities was affecting their production. Now with the car for transportation of seedlings and a proper drying facility, the workload has reduced, and allows the cooperative to distribute its production more easily.

CHRELA

Cooperative "Chrela" was founded in 2015 to work on milk processing and dairy production. The dairy factory with the cheese processing line serves not only cooperative members but also the local villagers, who will be able to sell their milk to the factory and who eventually will become members of the cooperative. The cooperative produces cheese, and dairy products and plans to start producing artisan cheese in the future, which will bring more income. Cooperative members participated in range of trainings, and with the given knowledge, are able to successfully manage the factory.

"The project helps people develop not only economically but personally. Apart from being financed, we participated in a lot of trainings. We saw some international experience which is useful for us, this gives us chance to move forward and scale up. That is our aim".





Cooperative Tsikara was founded in 2014 and works on dairy production, aiming at high quality natural products. The cooperative has built a cheese factory with their own funds. With the financial assistance from the project, the cooperative acquired additional equipment to the dairy processing line received thanks to the support from ACDA, which allows expanding and increasing effectiveness of the dairy production. The cooperative plans to employ up to 20 people once the factory is on full operational capacity.

Cooperative "Zeskho" is located in the very remote village of Zeskho, in Kvemo Svaneti region, and is located at the highest point of all the cooperatives in Georgia. The members of cooperatives with their families traditionally practiced potato production and continued it as a cooperative. Working in strict conditions with very harsh winters and difficult-to access roads, the cooperative couldn't use full advantage of the natural and unique soil. Workload has reduced and became easier after the cooperative received a tractor and additional equipment for cultivating the land and for harvesting potatoes.

"Collective work increases the work productivity. Besides the interest towards cooperative work increases in the region and it is important especially for reducing youth migration from the village."









MTSVANE PHOTOLI

Cooperative "Mtsvane Photoli" works on basil production. Although its members were experienced on vegetable production in greenhouse, basil production was a completely new area for all of them. With project support, the cooperative was provided with a greenhouse ventilation and heating systems, while its members benefited from the trainings, including new technologies and methods in basil production. The local markets for basil products seem promising, but the cooperative plans not to stop on just one type of production and wants to add vegetables.

"For us, the trainings were crucial because we didn't have experience with new production methods and we learned a lot. Now we plan to expand to vegetable cultures as well. With all these efforts, we will develop ourselves".







AGROSERVICE

The cooperative works on production and selling of annual crops, including maize, soya and others, and provides technical assistance services for farmers. The tractor, which the cooperative received through grant scheme, is the main facility that made the workload easier and being crucial to allow enlarging their business activities.

"In the future we plan to bring more technical equipment, to be able to serve the members of our cooperative in affordable prices."



Cooperative "Farmer 2015" cultivates corn, while its members also practice cattle breeding. Currently the cooperative consists of 14 people and plans to enlarge and increase production with new methods and technical equipment received through the grant scheme. The cooperative is also interested in innovations: with the project support, "Farmer 2015" has implemented a pilot activity on wheat production and is developing hybridation techniques for improved corn production.

"Before, the production was little, we also weren't able to follow the proper schedule for sowing. Last year we managed to produce the food for our own cattle so that the cooperative members didn't have to buy them on market."



CHIBATI

The members of the cooperative "Chibati" have long tradition of working in tea sector, as the region and the village where the cooperative is located has always been famous for its tea. As a cooperative, the members started the process of rehabilitating tea plantations and managed to engage the local population in this work. The cooperative tries to encourage local population to get involved in revival of the tea sector. With the given financial support, the cooperative received the tea processing equipment to run a factory. The immediate plans are to increase the production and export to larger markets, for which the cooperative conducts negotiations with potential buyers.

"There's a good potential to develop tea sector and help local population improve their economic conditions. We would like to increase tea plantations and make the full use of the factory's capacities. Later, we plan to provide packed tea bags to the market that will increase our profits".

NAGOMARI




Cooperative Nagomari is working on rehabilitating their tea plantations. Its members hope to reach 12-13 tons of production per year. With the grant support, the old wooden equipment was replaced by newest technology, and a tea bag production line has been installed. This way the cooperative is able to work on quality and aim at high standards, allowing them to sell to large supermarkets.

Apart from cooperative members, the village population is benefiting largely from the cooperative, as the cooperative is employing at least 35 families in tea plantations during the production season.

"Cooperatives are crucial for agricultural development. Although in the beginning people were sceptic about our work, the development of our cooperative gave stimulus to other people to start taking care of their own plantations. Our village has a large potential with the tea sector and we should be able to use it well"





Cooperative "Nergebi" was founded in 2014 and its members are all experienced to work on different types of seedlings (fruits, decorative trees, trees for wind protection, etc.). Through project support, the cooperative built a greenhouse that is used for keeping seedlings in winter and for producing vegetables the rest of the year. This cooperative had a long practice of cooperation of up to 8 years and they continue their work as a cooperative more enthusiastically. "Nergebi" is trying to get certification for their seedling business to ensure high quality for their customers.

"It's different and better when you are working as a cooperative, people know us more, we help each other and the work becomes easier, there's more income and less costs for the members"

"We felt that we were supported with the program, as they helped us with trainings, market research, we started to produce more and hope to increase the quantity and quality of our production".







GURIIS TKHILI

Cooperative "Guriis Tkhili" was founded in 2014 with 5 members and since then, reached up to 96 members. Hazelnut factory with the processing line has become fully functional and the cooperative expects to add additional processing machinery, including roasting equipment, and employ and incorporate more people outside the cooperative. Apart from hazelnut processing, the cooperative plans to expand its activities to advocate full rehabilitation and recovery of hazelnut plantations from the diseases. The plan for the cooperative is to reach out to bigger markets and buyers, while also producing roasted hazelnuts and different hazelnut sweets.



Agrolikhauri was founded in 2015. The cooperative is working on the ecological production of hazelnuts, which before they had to sell to factories to be processed. With the project support, Agrolikhauri has a fully equipped factory which allows adding value to their production. In the future the cooperative plans to produce their own hazelnut products.




SOPHLIS IMEDI

Cooperative "Sophlis Imedi" works on hazelnut production and processing. The cooperative is the only main enterprise functioning in the area and had gained a social function as many people of nearby villages benefit from its work. Apart from cooperative members, Soplis Imedi employs 50 workers from the village during 9 months a year on a permanent basis. The hazelnut drying facility that was purchased through grant support was very important for a cooperative to get quality hazelnuts. The cooperative plans to expand and directly reach European markets. For this aim, it has established working relationships with investors through the mediation of the project.

"Since we started, the cooperative has become stronger, the people in the village us saw the success and we became attractive to more people around, as they are willing to join the cooperative. This proves that cooperative movement is moving forward."





GEJETI

Cooperative 'Gejeti" was founded in 2015. Having its members well-experienced in chicken hatching and production, the cooperative got an incubator with project support, together with trainings on the use of the facility. The future plan of the cooperative is to establish a slaughterhouse.

"If not the financial support, we wouldn't be able to build this, because we didn't have any technical resources for it. Now we want to enlarge and promote our business with others to encourage people and contribute to the strengthening of our economy".
